**Q.** What type of events is the bus available for?

**A.** Professional, trade, civic, educational or public (public relations firms that organize for public service or educational sponsors). The AeroSpace Bus is a government owned vehicle and cannot attend fund raiser events.

**Q.** Is there a cost associated with the bus?

**A.** The AeroBus does **not** charge a fee to attend events.

**Q.** Can a separate admission be charged for viewing the bus?

**A.** NO! Nor can any admission increase be affected because of the addition of the bus.

**Q.** Are the bus drivers hired just to drive the bus?

**A.** **NO!** The drivers and operators **voluntarily** support the AeroBus in addition to their regular jobs at NASA Glenn.

**Q.** Will every attempt be made to accommodate my request?

**A.** Yes! Your event will be posted on the schedule as **TENTATIVE** with driver marked as **TBD** until the arrangements are finalized.

**Q.** Can I request a deadline date to confirm or cancel my request?

**A.** Yes, we will make the greatest effort to meet your deadline date.

**Q.** How many people can the bus accommodate at one time?

**A.** The bus seats 40 people at one time.

**Q.** What activities are associated with the bus?

**A.** It has a 42-in plasma screen video theatre display with Hi-Fi stereo sound. NASA DVD movies are approximately 11 to 15 minutes in length. Videos are geared toward the younger audience, but enjoyed by all ages. The driver/operator will answer NASA related questions to the best of their ability.

The AeroBus is a 1998 MCI 102 E Series Intercity Coach.

Dimensions:

Height = 141.25 inches (3587 mm) from top of roof hatches

Width = 102 inches (2500 mm) includes mirrors and side turn lights

Weight = 49,900 Lbs. (22,640 Kg)

Power Requirements:

The bus has two 100-ft cords: one is an 110V, 20-amp plug and the other is a 250V, 50 amp single-phase plug. If no power sources are available at the site, the bus can be powered by two onboard generators.

Cooling System:

The bus has three roof air conditioner/heater units for visitor comfort.
